11 Cases v. Guatemala

I. COMPLIANCE AND FOLLOW-UP ADDENDUM

August 21, 2014: In a hearing to follow up on the State's compliance with previously adopted measures, the State failed to provide updates on eleven cases.² Instead, it adopted a radical change in position, questioning the Court's competence in the underlying decisions that led to the current monitoring compliance.³ The Court agreed with the Commission that the State was attempting to reopen the cases and make arguments that did not correspond to this stage of the international process.⁴ It further reminded us that, when raised, the Court resolved preliminary objections and questions regarding the Court's competence to hear the cases.⁵ The Court also noted that the State accepted, partial or complete, international responsibility at the time the cases were heard.⁶

As such, the Court decided (1) that the State's position in regards to its obligations under the eleven cases was evidently disrespectful and contrary to the international principle of abiding to such obligations in good faith; (2) to require the State to adopt, in a definitive way and the fastest time, all the necessary measures to reach compliance with the Court's decisions; and (3) to require the Court's Secretary to notify the State, the victims and their families, and the Commission of this resolution.
