

María Nina Lupe Rosario Andrade Salmón v. Bolivia

I. COMPLIANCE AND FOLLOW-UP ADDENDUM¹

February 05, 2018: The Court reviewed the State’s compliance with the following reparations: (1) lifting precautionary measures issued against Ms. Andrade in the *Street Lamps* case; (2) defining Ms. Andrade’s legal situation in the *Street Lamps* case; (3) publishing and disseminating the Judgment; and (4) paying non-pecuniary damages and reimbursing costs and expenses specified in the Judgment.²

The Court found that the State properly lifted the precautionary measures against Ms. Andrade.³ Similarly, the State fulfilled its obligation to define Ms. Andrade’s legal situation in the *Street Lamps* case.⁴ Additionally, the State adequately published the Judgment.⁵ Finally, the State complied with its obligation to compensate non-pecuniary damage to Ms. Andrade and reimburse the costs and expenses for her representatives.⁶
