
Omar Humberto Maldonado Vargas et al. v. Chile

I. COMPLIANCE AND FOLLOW-UP ADDENDUM¹

August 30, 2017: The State fully complied with its obligation to: (1) publish the Judgment, (2) publicly acknowledge its international responsibility, (3) install a plaque naming the victims and circumstances of the violations of their human rights, (4) provide the victims a mechanism to review and annul convictions that can be made available to others sentenced during the Chilean military dictatorship by the War Council, and (5) reimburse the representatives of victims costs and expenses.² The State partially complied with its obligation to pay all twelve victims and compensate them for non-pecuniary damages but one.³ The Court kept the proceedings for compliance monitoring open regarding the State's duty to investigate, and the payment of compensation to the heirs of the deceased victim, Mr. Gustavo Raúl Lastra Saavedra.⁴
